Nehemiah: Restoration (Ch 11:1-12:26)

God is looking for a few good men and women who are willing to follow His lead.

1. God expects His people to follow Him. (7:4-5, 11:1)

- a. We are rarely given the plan, we are simply asked to willingly and sacrificially obey His leadership.
 - God, often desires for us to depend upon him as an act of blind obedience. (Psalm 119:105, Matt 4:19).
 - God is fulfilling His promises to His people, but it would require their acceptance of His gift. (1Chronicles 28:8)
- b. Israel could finally become a "Holy" city (11:1)
 - The people were "camping" (Nehemiah 11:30) in the promised land but now they were able to make a home in Jerusalem.
 - This is a beautiful fulfillment of prophecy (Jeremiah 31:40) and was dependent upon their ongoing understanding of the repentance and sacrificial worship God deserves.

2. Restoration happens when (and only when) we are all in.

- a. God is looking for individuals who are willing to wholeheartedly join Him in what He is doing.
 - This begins with an initial step of obedience, declaring, "Here I am send me." (Isaiah 6:8) This is the logical response to our God of grace.
 - After the initial step of obedience, this requires ongoing following the Lord and His leadership in our lives. (Luke 9:23)

- o Your gift makes you valuable.
- Every labor done in love is remembered by God, never forgotten, regardless of who gets public credit for it.
- o Followership is underrated.
- b. The price of admission is to be "all in."
 - o They were "volunteering" more than their time. They were donating themselves and trading their personal agenda for God's agenda. (11:2)
 - Some chose, and some were chosen, but all willfully put their names in as potential citizens of Jerusalem.
 - This obedience is always worth the investment. (Matt 13:44-46)
- c. Some of the best and brightest of Israel were willing to follow God's leadership. (Nehemiah 11:3,6,8,14)
 - o They were honored and blessed for their sacrifice.
 - o God often works out the details of his promises through the mundane efforts of his people.
